It's hard to believe, there are only three months left in 2025. And these last few months are a window for making the most of your charitable giving.

Starting in 2026, the new One Big Beautiful Bill Act (OBBBA) will bring some big changes to how charitable deductions work. That means the gifts you make this year could go further both for the causes you care about, like the mission of the Northwest Sarcoma Foundation, and for your own tax savings.

What's Changing in 2026?

Beginning next year:

- New Threshold Charitable gifts will only be deductible once they exceed 0.5% of your taxable income. (For example, if your taxable income is \$500,000, the first \$2,500 of giving won't count toward deductions.)
- Permanent Limit Cash gifts will continue to be limited to 60% of your Adjusted Gross Income.
- Deduction Cap for Top Earners For those in the highest tax bracket, deductions will be capped at a 35% marginal rate, reducing their overall value.

In short: the rules will be less generous starting next year.

A Smart 2025 Strategy: "Bunching"

One approach many donors are considering is called bunching. Instead of spreading gifts over several years, you make a larger contribution in 2025. This way, you take advantage of today's more favorable rules, then use the standard deduction in future years. Be a part of

A great way to do this is through a Donor Advised Fund (DAF):

- Make one larger gift to your DAF before December 31, 2025.
- Claim the full deduction this year.
- Let the funds grow tax-free in the DAF.

• Distribute gifts to nonprofits you care about like, the Northwest Sarcoma Foundation, in the years ahead, on your own

schedule.

Why It Matters

By acting before year-end, you can maximize your impact under the current rules and position yourself to keep supporting the causes you love, like the Northwest Sarcoma Foundation, in the future.



#### **How to Double Your Donation!**



Every company with a matching gift program has its own process. Some may process matches monthly, quarterly, or annually.

Even though the timing and details vary, most programs follow the same general steps for nonprofits to receive a matched gift:

- 1. Identify donor employment where do you work?
- Check eligibility, determine if your employer offers a matching gift program we send an email through Double the Donation.
- 3. Guide donors Double the Donation helps you navigate your company's process for submitting the match request. a. Or you can ask us to send you a copy of your donation receipt for you to submit independently.

Once you have submitted the match request, the next steps depend on your employer's procedures. Common scenarios include:


- Your employer sends both the donation and an email specifying the details (e.g., who it's from and whether it should support a particular program).
- Your employer sends only a check or electronic payment, requiring us to follow up for your information.
- Your employer uses an online platform where we can access all necessary details.
  - We have a few of you who donate through your company's portal, and they match us through platforms like Benevity
    or iPay/Mars. Thank you!
- Your employer asks us to confirm your original gift, or you may need to provide proof of donation.
  - We are happy to provide!

To make the process easier, we partner with Double the Donation, a platform that streamlines matching gifts. This integration reduces friction by connecting you to your company's program, removing the need for you to submit extra paperwork and eliminating our need to verify the gift manually.

Each year, matching gift funds directly support patients. While they may seem like a small percentage of our overall fundraising, they make a real impact by providing Help\$ Grants and care packages.

So, when you receive a Double the Donation email, please don't ignore it or check your junk mail for the email. Take a moment to check if your company offers a match—you could make your donation go even farther for patients in need.

#### **HOPE IN ACTION - TAMI'S STORY**

In June 2024, Tami faced a new and unexpected battle: a diagnosis of Dedifferentiated Chondrosarcoma, a rare bone cancer. This wasn't Tami's first encounter with cancer; she had just celebrated her 10-year remission anniversary from ovarian cancer. Her family has a history of Osteochondroma, a hereditary condition causing benign bone tumors. While her family members all have this condition, none have ever developed cancer from it. Tami, however, wonders if her previous chemotherapy treatment for ovarian cancer might have played a role in her recent diagnosis, though doctors are still unsure of any direct link. The first sign something was wrong came one night when Tami woke up with excruciating shoulder pain. An avid golfer, she initially dismissed it as a sports injury and made an orthopedic appointment. At the appointment, the doctor focused solely on a pre-existing osteochondroma on her arm, completely overlooking her

shoulder blade. An X-ray was taken, and an MRI was ordered.



- IN 2024 APPROXIMATELY 9.600 CHILDREN (0-14) & 5.300 ADOLESCENTS (15-19) WERE DIAGNOSED WITH CANCER
- ABOUT 1/ 260 CHILDREN WILL DEVELOP CANCER BEFORE THE AGE OF 20.
- MOST NEW CANCER DIAGNOSES IN CHILDREN ARE FOR LEUKEMIA (28.1%) AND BRAIN/CNS CANCERS (26.5%).
- IT IS ESTIMATED THAT THERE WILL BE 13.7 MILLION CASES OF CHILDHOOD CANCER RETWEEN 2020-2050
  - 45% WILL GO UNDIAGNOSED AND 11.1 MILLION WILL DIE IF NO FURTHER INVESTMENTS IN INTERVENTIONS ARE MADE
  - ALMOST 85%. WILL BE CONCENTRATED IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES.
