2020 brought its challenges but the Northwest Sarcoma Foundation was and is determined to continue to provide hope, education, and support to Sarcoma patients and their families in the Pacific Northwest while investing in research to cure Sarcomas.

Here's how we:

SURVIVED

2020 changed the way everyone did business and interacted on a social level. The Northwest Sarcoma Foundation found itself having to evaluate all aspects of its operations to survive.

- Reduced overall expenses by approximately **48%**.
- Reduced staff by one part-time employee.
- Used approximately **13.5%** of investment reserves to ensure the mission continued.

ADAPTED

As the year progressed we adapted to the "new norm".

- Refocused the financial amount of Help\$ grants and the number of grants awarded each month. Provided **98** grants, continuing the program through your support.
- Pivoted the in-person Dragonslayer Walks to virtual. Leading to over **eight** states joining in the fun.
- Redeveloped events and meet ups into virtual to allow us to continue to connect to you.
- Reconnected with you using health guidelines and creativity.

THRIVED

In 2021, we will move into the next phase and progression.

- Received a COVID Community Impact Grant from Oregon Health & Science University to help sustain Help\$ Grants in Oregon throughout 2021.
- Applied for M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust grant for new technology to advance us in 2021.
- Improved our year-end appeal with full mission impact which included personal video, targeted mail and email. Resulting in over **300%** increase year-end giving.
- Improved our social media and online presence.
- Reinstating care packages to patients and adding packages for survivors of Sarcoma angels.
- Planning to continue virtual events while developing a plan for in-person events in 2021, if permitted.
